TO ALL CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANTS:

GENTLEMEN:

Knowing that you are interested in the recent efforts to bring about one national accountancy organization, we are sending herewith a full statement on the history of this matter and the actions of the Institute in relation to it.

You will note from this document that the Institute has limited future admissions to certified public accountants and that it has made arrangements for direct and continuous co-operation with the state societies, through creation of an advisory council of state society presidents which has already met and organized itself.

Continuing its effort to unite the profession, the council of the Institute has authorized waiver of all entrance fees to members of state societies in good standing who are otherwise eligible and who make application for admission to the Institute prior to September 1, 1936. (See page 18 of the statement.)

If you are not fully familiar with the activities of the Institute and the services which it renders to the profession and to its members, you will also find of interest the enclosed report of current activities which is reprinted from the January *Bulletin*.
