John M. King (about whom I have speken to you before in regard to the SEC) advises that it is his belief it would be possible for the President to have direct resignations of both Manuel 7.

Commissioner Cohen and Commissioner Wheat, Francis W.

Richard Smith (who is a "disclosure" man) would be favored by King for the Chairmanship over Budge (who is a "regulatory"man).

If this arrangement could be brought about, it would give the President the appointment of a Republican (which would provide Republican control) plus a suitable Democrat. With two Nixon appointees on the Commission, plus a Nixon designee as Chairman, this would make the 5-man SEC a Nixon Commission.

Appropriate changes at the staff level would thus be facilitated.
