Dear Mr. Justice Hughes:

First, as the son of a loyal and steadfast American who went to a premature grave with silver plates replacing much of the bone structure in the upper portion of his body--the result of four long years in the War of 1861-1865--and, secondly, by way of my personal fidelity to the honored traditions and constituted authority of our great Nation, and in recognition of high merit and distinguished service on the part of yourself and colleagues, constituting the honorable membership of the United States Supreme Court, admittedly the ranking judicial body of the World, I feel that it is both fitting and proper to here express and give renewed assurance of my unswerving confidence in and continued unconditional allegiance to each and every member of your most honored and august body.

A loose and slanderous tongue, inspired by envious hate of a recognized authority superior to his own imaginative and egotistic conception of his own importance, will deceive besides himself, only those who choose to be deceived! Upon the latest outburst of brazen arrogance and unprecedented presumption by the Chief Executive, sad to say, the peoples of a shocked world will look and listen with keen understanding--and be not deceived, even among the most unenlightened. Unhappily we have a mad man in the White House--a man driven by a maniac obsession for personal power and intoxicated by the glamor of self-assumed tho vain-glorious role of the modern Great Messiah.

And so we humbly thank God for our Supreme Court, the last line bulwark of our great Republic.
