Commissioner Healy told me this morning that on his recent visit to the New York office he saw a rather voluminous report made by the Security Information Analysis Section on trading in the stock of Loft Candy. He also stated that he had talked with Pat Down who indicated, I believe, that the New York office had not made any investigation of that case although they had received the voluminous report, because, in the opinion of the New York office, it was not worth the time and energy to investigate it. Could you advise me as to what the status of this case has been and is?
