The revised Rule was the subject of study by that Committee and its conclusions are set forth herein.

If you use the original version of the Committee's comments, please change the language about the world leadership of the United States and that of New York City as the financial center of the world. It could read instead that we are "concerned lest the position of the United States as a leading financial center be seriously impaired."
