Women employed in full-time white-collar jobs in the Federal Government increased by 38,843 in the year ended October 31, 1974, the U.S. Civil Service Commission reported today.

This advance continued the trend of recent years in which the goal of equal opportunity for women has been given Government-wide emphasis through the Federal Women's Program. The current emphasis on assuring consideration of women for employment in higher level positions and observance of International Women's Year should assure continuation of the trend.

The Commission's October 1974 survey showed that women represented 61 percent of the overall net increase of 63,677 in Federal white-collar jobs in the 1-year period, raising their representation in that work force by nearly 1 percent -- from 34.0 in October 1973 to 34.9 a year later. The number of jobs held by men increased by only 24,834.

Excluding the U.S. Postal Service employees from the overall white-collar total, the percentage of women in Federal white-collar positions increased from 40.8 percent in 1973 to 41.7 in 1974.

The 1974 survey data also indicate increases in the number of women employed in all major grade groupings -- GS-1 through GS-6, GS-7 through GS-12, and GS-13 and higher -- reflecting a continuation of the advancement of women into middle level and higher level white-collar jobs.

The 1974 survey shows that women held 71.2 percent (419,066) of all positions at the GS-1 through 6 and equivalent grade levels, presently \$5,559 to \$12,934; 25.6 percent (158,430) of those in the middle grades, GS-7 through 12, now \$11,046 to \$25,200; and 4.7 percent (9,317) of the positions at the GS-13 level and above, now \$22,906 to \$37,800. In the Postal Service, women were employed in 85,863 (16.3 percent) of the 526,576 positions in 1974, up from 15.0 percent a year earlier, representing an increase of 10,656 positions. And 37.7 percent of the 26,016 positions in the "other white-collar pay plans" were held by women in 1974.

Because of a change in collection of data and definition of white-collar positions in pay systems other than the General Schedule, direct comparisons of grade distributions in the 1973 and 1974 surveys cannot be made. However, the new approach will make possible more meaningful comparisons in future annual surveys. (See attached technical discussion of information about the data for a more complete explanation of the changes in the 1974 survey.)

The survey also revealed significant gains for women in a number of occupational groupings. The greatest gain was recorded in the large General Administrative-Clerical-and Office Services occupations, in which an increase of 10,619 brought the total number of women in the group to 323,369. Other occupational groups in which women made significant gains included the Postal Field (up 8,421); Legal and Kindred (up 4,578); Budget (up 2,155); Social Science, Psychology, and Welfare (up 2,047); and Personnel Management and Industrial Relations (up 1,513). The number of women increased in all occupational groups except Mathematics/Statistics and Education groups, in which slight decreases occurred (see Table D).

Tables attached also show changes in the employment of women in mid-level positions, grades GS-9 through 12 (now \$13,482 to \$25,200), and higher-level positions, grades GS-13 and up (now \$22,906 to \$37,800), between October 1973 and October 1974. The tables show that employment of women in the mid-level grades increased from 17.1 percent to 18.9 percent, and in the higher-level positions from 4.5 percent to 4.7 percent.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE 1974 DATA SURVEY

Coverage

The data presented represent worldwide full-time white-collar Government employment (General Schedule and other non-wage systems). All Federal departments and agencies are included in this report except members and employees of the Congress, the Judicial Branch, the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, the Central Intelligence Agency, and the National Security Agency. Women who are working on a part-time basis or who have blue-collar occupations are not included. Tables A and B indicate summary employment totals by sex in the Federal agencies for 1974 and 1973, respectively.

Changes in Definition

Beginning with the 1974 survey of employment of women, the definition of "equivalent" grades to the General Schedule was revised to more realistically represent equivalencies based on job classification criteria. In previous surveys, all non-wage pay systems were equated to the General Schedule either grade-to-GS grade or annual salary-to-GS grade. Beginning with the 1974 survey, only graded pay plans were made equivalent to GS grades. They are as follows: FC (Foreign Agency for International Development); FO, FR, FI, FS (Foreign Service pay plans); VM, VN (Veterans Administration's medical and nursing pay plans); and SA, SB, SD, SE, SG, SM (Tennessee Valley Authority). In the 1974 survey, 1,404,660 (71.8 percent) employees were placed in the General Schedule and equivalent category. The postal pay plans could not be equated to the General Schedule; therefore 526,576 Postal Service employees (26.9 percent) are shown separately by postal levels. All other white-collar pay plans are shown by salary group intervals (26,016 employees or 1.3 percent). For these reasons, comparability between the 1974 survey and any prior year does not exist for tables showing grades or grade groupings. The new reporting system will make future year-to-year comparison more meaningful in measuring the progress of women in the Federal service. Table C shows the 1974 distribution of total full-time white-collar employment by GS and equivalent grades and salary groups.
