I am not exactly certain whether an emotional farewell is what any of us need at this juncture, but I felt compelled to write to you, briefly, as I prepare to leave the Commission.

In the months and years ahead, I wish you much success, and your family much good health and happiness. No one I know deserves that any more than you. And, as gratuitous as it might seem, if I can ever be of help, I hope that you will not hesitate to call on me.
