Dear Mr. President:

As a former Member of the Commission under President Eisenhower, I urge the reappointment of Commissioner John R. Evans as a Member of the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Commissioner Evans has had extended service and has been a devoted, hard-working Member of the Commission.

Over the years of my affiliation with the Commission as a Member of its Staff and as a Commissioner and, thereafter, as an active practicing lawyer before the Commission, I have followed Commissioner Evans's tenures with much interest.

He is an intensely dedicated Commissioner. I am aware that, from time to time, he may disagree with other Members of the Commission, including the Chairman. Regardless of any such intellectual disagreements, I should think all would recognize his devotion to the Commission and the statutes which it administers. The Commission has had a long history of creative administration by Members who do not fit a monolithic mold. I did not, while I was there, consider that I had to be fitted to any mold.
