The Commission considered a memorandum from the Office of Legislative Affairs, dated July 15, 2002, concerning a Congressional request for briefings, answers to certain questions, and documents concerning WorldCom, Inc. (HO-9440), Tyco International, Inc. (HO-9421), Global Crossing Ltd. (LA-2563), Xerox Corporation (HO-9013), Qwest Communications International, Inc. (D-2455), Rite Aid Corporation (NY-6800), Adelphia Communications Corporation (NY-7026), Waste Management, Inc. (HO-3372), Kmart Corporation (HO-9410), Sunbeam Corporation (HO-3433), Enron Corporation (FW-2400), Peregrine Systems, Inc. (HO-9404), and MicroStrategy Incorporated (HO-8953).

Staff recommended that the Commission:

- A. authorize SEC staff, if necessary, to brief the House Committee on Energy and Commerce ("the Committee") and its subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations ("the Subcommittee") and their staff on non-public information related to this matter and to provide briefing updates upon further request from the Committee;
- B. authorize SEC staff to provide Committee and Subcommittee staff with information, and copies of, or in certain cases only access to, documents as further specified; and
- C. authorize Commission staff to provide similar briefings, information, and copies of documents and document access to other committees and subcommittees of Congress upon receipt of an initial written request and one day's advice memorandum notice to the Commission.

Commissioners Hunt and Glassman approved the staff's recommendation, 2-0, with Chairman Pitt not participating. Consistent with the Commission's quorum rule, 17 CFR 200.41, two members constitute a quorum for this matter.
